It was a very informative program on how to use color and places to look for colors and shapes, as well as explaining value and contrast. She said in putting colors together, the color wheel is your friend.

Becky told about the app, Adobe Capture, that creates color themes based on an image, makes an image multiply into patterns, and a whole lot more! She also mentioned Color Scheme Designer for the computer that will create colour combinations that work together well. They are both amazing tools to use!
