

Mastectomy Drain Scarves

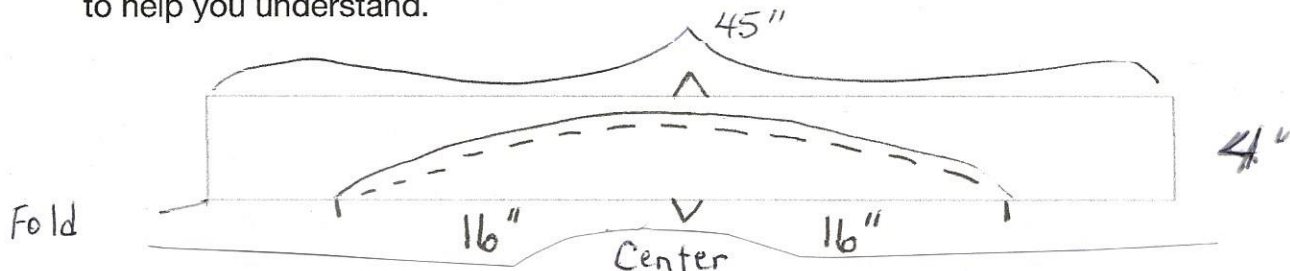
“A” piece - Cut 1 piece - 8” x 45” can be longer if desired, up to 50”

“B” piece - Cut 2 pieces - 6”x 18” these will be the pockets

“C” piece- 1 piece of batting - cut 4” by 45”; if you choose a longer “A”, then cut the batting to the same length.

Fold “A” right sides together across the width. “A” is now 4” x 45. Place the batting on “A” and stitch 1/4” seam along the open side. Tip: lay the batting toward the feed dogs with the fabric on top, it sees easier. Turn and press.

Fold piece “A” in the center (4”x 22 1/2”); place the template on the folded edge of piece “A” (not the sewn edge) and carefully cut along the template. This will make the curvature for the neck. Turn under 1/2”, pinning as you turn the edge under. Top stitch the neck opening or you can close the neck by hand. Please refer to the diagram to help you understand.



Turn ends of the scarf toward the inside of the scarf and top stitch.

POCKETS: Fold in half, right sides together. Sew a 1/4” seam along both sides and finish the seam with a zig zag or serger. Turn right sides out and press. Roll under a 1/4” hem and top stitch. Press.

Attach the pockets to the ends of the scarf by opening the pocket and inserting the scarf inside the pocket. Make a couple of rows of stitching to secure the pockets.

Sew an 18” piece of ribbon to each inside edge of the scarf. This placement should be just where the neck stitching stopped.
